<sup>Note1</sup> According to section 75(7)(a)(ii) of the EAC(EP)(LC) Reg, any ballot paper, which appears to be not marked in accordance with section 55(2) using the chop to be affixed to give a single “✓” in the circle opposite the list of candidates of the elector’s choice, is questionable and the RO or PRO should decide whether the vote is to be counted. When making the decision, if the RO or PRO believes the ballot paper is not marked with the chop provided at the polling station, the vote is not to be counted pursuant to section 80(1)(ha).
